About this No-Cost Workshop:

How do I know how much of the water I produce is generating revenue, and why should I care? Understanding and controlling non-revenue water, including lost and unaccounted for water, is important to maximize system revenues, cut energy use and operating costs, improve water quality, address failing infrastructure, and mitigate impacts of limited water resources from drought or contamination.

The first step is understanding the types and quantities of non-revenue water in your water system. The workshop will begin with a basic understanding of the water audit/water balance process. The next step is to validate the data. The final step is developing a plan for controlling non-revenue water that is specific to your utility.

You'll also learn about Arizona's own Water Loss Control Program. The Water Infrastructure Finance Authority of Arizona (WIFA) and the Arizona Department of Water Resources (ADWR) are partnering on this free program to provide selected utilities with a foundational understanding of the M36 methodology, how it is applied, and how water audit data may be used to assess and improve water loss performance at the utility level.

WIFA staff will be on-hand to describe the program to interested participants. Approximately 30 systems across the state will be selected to participate in Phase 2 of the program.
